About Maitimo

Maitimo

Personality

The eldest son of **Fëanor**. Like all other Fëanorians, Maitimo has a Thing that he is outstanding at; Maitimo's Thing is people. Maitimos are extraordinarily good at knowing and understanding people, and also at persuading and manipulating them. A Maitimo's model of a person will very rarely be wrong, and they will be able to guess what the person is thinking with a fidelity that approaches mind-reading. Maitimos can use this ability to convince someone that the sky is green, that Maitimo is their best friend in the whole world, and that mass murder is the way to go, and readers are not immune to this effect. Maitimos are *very good* at ruling countries, because they know all of their subordinates and their strengths and weaknesses, and can throw the right people at a problem at a moment's notice. Maitimos generally have the biases and prejudices of their society on an instinctual level, though they can often notice them and work to make their society better.

Origin

Maitimo is originally from the **Silmarillion**, and the version there still gets frequently written.

Name attractors

Maitimos' names are generally based off of his names in the Silmarillion, which are **Nelyafinwë Maitimo** in Quenya and **Maedhros** in Sindarin. (Technically there is also **Russandol**, but that gets used less often in glowfic.) "Nelyafinwë" means "third Finwë" literally, and "my father's half-siblings are illegitimate" metaphorically; this is a meaning that gets used in non-Arda as well.

Attractors

- Obligate gay
- Never belongs to the underprivileged gender
- Born into a position of power (though how much power it is varies depending on society)

- Strong pressure to keep his relationship with Findekano secret (usually because of homophobia, but not always)
- Likes to know everyone's names
- Awful things happen to him

Associated Characters

By lintamande:

- **Fëanor**: Maitimo's father; normally a fairly acrimonious relationship because Fëanor thinks that people stuff is not worth Maitimo's time, and also for family feud reasons.
- **Nerdanel**: Maitimo's mother
- Maitimo's younger brothers:
 - **Maglor**: the musician; in the standard Arda trajectory, he and Maitimo are the last survivors.
 - **Celegorm**: the hunter
 - **Caranthir**: the economist
 - **Curufin**: the engineer
 - **Amrod and Amras**: the twins
- **Findekano**: Maitimo's half-cousin and secret boyfriend
- **Finwë**: Maitimo's grandfather. Maitimo is frequently considered or planned to be his heir.

Others:

- **Bell (Alicorn)**: Maitimos and Bells are often shipped together, when the Bell is the right gender. When they're not, they tend to be good friends. (See Silmaril and also many sandboxes.)
- **Miles (Kappa)**: Notably in *there will be light*
- **Leareth (swimmer)**: Shipped together in at least two continuities.

Maitimo (Arda)

Maitimo/Maedhros

Personal History

The uninterrupted trajectory of standard Arda Maitimos is as follows:

Valinor

Maitimo is born as the eldest son of Fëanaro in Valinor, where he grows up in the expectation that one day, his grandfather Finwë will retire as King of the Noldor and Maitimo will be King. Complicating this is the fact that Finwë wants Maitimo to get married and have kids first, and Maitimo is too gay and too in love with Findekano for that.

When the Valar release Melkor on parole and Melkor starts subtly stirring up trouble between Fëanaro and Nolo-finwë, Maitimo tries to smooth things over for a while. However, eventually he is forced to pick a side, and sides with his father. When Melkor kills the Trees, murders Finwë, and steals the Silmarils, Maitimo swears the [Oath of Fëanor](#) alongside his father and brothers.

Alqualondë, Ship-Burning, and Capture

The Noldor then run into the problem that there is no way to leave Valinor without ships, and after the Teleri refuse to lend their ships or teach the Noldor how to build their own, the Fëanorians proceed to take the Telerin ships by force. This is called the First Kinslaying, or the Kinslaying at Alqualondë, and the Valar proceed to issue a [Doom](#) sentencing anyone who follows the House of Fëanor to, essentially, failure, betrayal, and death.

The Fëanorians take the ships to Beleriand, and Maitimo promises Findekano that they will send the ships back to ferry the Nolo-finweans over. However, when they get across, Fëanaro burns the ships instead. Maitimo cannot stop him and stands aside. Unfortunately, one of Maitimo's twin brothers is on one of the ships at the time, and he dies in the fire. The Fëanorian host is then attacked by Morgoth's forces, and Fëanaro promptly gets killed.

Maitimo, now King of (a part of) the Noldor, then goes to a parley with the Enemy, which the Enemy uses to capture him. Maitimo then gets tortured in Angband for fifty years, which features *many* hallucinations meant to make Maitimo think he's been rescued. Sauron is especially interested in Maitimo. Eventually, Morgoth hangs him up on a cliff, suspended by one hand.

Rescue and War

Meanwhile, the Noloſinwean hoſt makes it across the Grinding Ice to Endorë, Findekano finds out Maitimo has been captured, and decides to reſcue him, deſpite ſtill feeling betrayed by the burning of the ſhips. With the help of a Manwë-ſent eagle, Findekano brings Maitimo out of Angband, though he has to cut off Maitimo's right hand to get him free of the cliff.

Maitimo is not at all convinced that he has actually been reſcued, and this is not yet another hallucination, but he pretends he thinks it's real to ſtretch out the time until he next gets tortured. He yields the crown to Noloſinwë and ſtrong-arms his brothers into going along with it. He alſo ſtarts using the name Maedhros at this point inſtead of Maitimo - Maitimo means "well-formed", and the Enemy liked using it.

The events of the Silmarillion proceed. Maitimo builds a fortress at Himring in the north, and plays his part in the war againſt Morgoth and the 400-year Siege of Angband. The Siege ends with the **Dagor Bragollach**, the Battle of Sudden Flame.

The Nirnaeth and the Kinſlayings

Following the ſucceſs of Beren and Luthien's queſt to fetch a Silmaril from Morgoth's crown, Maitimo forms the Union of Maedhros, an alliance of many people of Elves and Men meant to take the war to Morgoth. The reſulting battle ends in utter failure. Findekano, by now King of the Noldor, is killed, and much of Beleriand is overrun by Morgoth's forces.

The Fëanorians now have no hope of getting the two Silmarils ſtill held by Morgoth, and their Oath forces them to attempt to get the one that is in Doriath. Doriath reſuſes to let them have it, and Maitimo and his brothers attack. This is called the Second Kinſlaying. Doriath is deſtroyed as a kingdom, but Elwing, the daughter of the king eſcapes, ſtill in poſſeſſion of the Silmaril. Celegorm, Caranthir, and Curufin die in the fighting. There is rather a lot of murder.

Maitimo, Macalaurë, and the ſurviving twin then attempt to reſiſt the Oath. This works poorly, ſince Oaths erode away people's ability to care about anything but the Oath. Eventually, Maitimo and his brothers aſſault the refugee camp at the Mouth of Sirion, where Elwing and the Silmaril are, deciding that they would rather attack while they ſtill care enough to minimize caſualties. This is the Third Kinſlaying. The ſurviving twin dies in the attack. Elwing takes the Silmaril and jumps into the ſea with it; ſhe ſurvives, but Maedhros and Maglor do not know this.

Kids, Deſpair, and Death

Elwing leaves behind her two ſix-year-old children, Elrond and Elros, and Maedhros and Maglor half take them hoſtage, half reſcue them. The kids end up loving them as their parents, though it is a complicated relationship.

By this point, Maedhros is very much not ſane. He is more *hoping* that this is all a hallucination than *afraid* of it, ſince if it's a hallucination, then none of the dead people are actually dead, and he's not a maſs murderer.

Eventually, the Valar come fight Morgoth, and even more eventually defeat him. Maedhros and Maglor try to take the two remaining Silmarils away from the triumphant army, and are permitted to do ſo. But the Silmarils, which were bleſſed by Varda not to endure the touch of evil, burn them. Maedhros takes one and jumps with it into a

fiery chasm.

Khemet

Setting: Golarion

Description:

Khemet is the Pharaoh of Osirion. His personal title is Ruby Prince.

Khemet is a high-level cleric of Abadar, the Lawful Neutral god of trade and prosperity. He was chosen as Pharaoh because he was the best candidate out of all the descendents of the previous Pharaoh, who was his grandfather (a Finwë). Officially, for historical reasons, he and Abadar are the same person. In practice, he has Maitimo-level social skills plus his crown is a really really impressive headband giving him bonuses to several of his stats, but he is not a god and can't even communicate all that well with Abadar, since Abadar is not particularly good at talking to mortals as Golarion gods go. Since Khemet is very Lawful, however, he (and most of his family) usually try not to acknowledge this unofficial fact even in private.

Khemet is married to his Findekano, and also to a whole bunch of women. Due to the "obligate gay" thing, he has a really difficult time with the part of his job that involves producing heirs, though after some years he eventually manages.

Khemet is very good at his job, but it doesn't really suit him that well, since Maitimos love talking to tons of people and he can't really do that due to all of the laws about how commoners have to address the Pharaoh. Part of why he picks out so many wives for himself is that they're simply people he can talk to without this involving much fuss.

Khemet is going to be happier after he dies and can live in Axis and not be the Pharaoh anymore.
